

## **PERSONAL TUTORIAL CURRICULUM FOR MR AL-MU'TASIM BILLAH AL-GADDAFI**

The programme will focus on national security issues and closely related topics – for example

- the geopolitical environment
- the dynamics of globalization
- the relevance of policy making and the political process to national security
- the impact and importance of national competitiveness to security

In addition, we will cover issues of organisation and leadership that are relevant to Mr Gaddafi's new role.

We will develop the curriculum with an international expert – Dr Geoffrey Edwardes, Director of the Centre for International Studies at Cambridge University and senior fellow of Pembroke College. At the end of this document we attach a more detailed outline of the curriculum. We will work with Mr Gaddafi to design the programme.

The programme will be delivered primarily in Libya, drawing on international experts and practitioners in the field of national security. For some expert meetings, Mr Gaddafi might travel to the UK or US. We will arrange meetings with leading international institutions and think tanks such as the International Institute for Security Studies, Chatham House, the Royal College of Defense Studies etc. Monitor will provide continuity throughout the programme, helping Mr Gaddafi to reflect on each session and to draw conclusions for action.

In general, we will expect to conduct one tutorial session per month. Mr Gaddafi will receive pre-reading one week before the tutorial session. Each tutorial session in Tripoli will require a full day – most likely 3 hours in the morning, 3 in the afternoon.

If Mr Gaddafi chooses to engage an English instructor, we will ensure that the language instruction is co-ordinated with the content of the curriculum.
